Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

September 25, 2022



Reading I: Amos 6: 1a, 4-7

Thus is the so-called “Third Woe” of Amos, in which he castigates the then luxury-loving rulers of Israel. They will be punished by God with exile.

Reading II: I Timothy 6: 11-16

Paul calls Timothy a “man of God” in this exhortation to avoid the love of money and other vices. He advises further to keep the commandments and remember Christ’s testimony before Pontius Pilate.

The Gospel: Luke 16: 19-31

This story is unique to Luke’s gospel. The rich man is very much like the dishonest steward we read about only last weekend. The closing verse underscores the fact that even miraculous events like the Resurrection do not automatically save people.

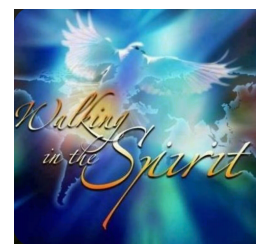

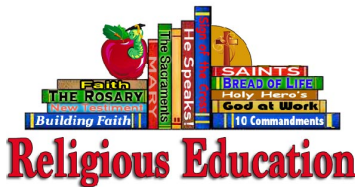

PREP Classes for the 2022 – 2023 school year began on Sunday, September 18, at 10:35 a.m. and on Monday, September 19, at 6:30 p.m. Stop in the Religious Education Office if you need a registration form. Classes continue each week until early May. The Summer portion of the weeklong PREP took place last July. These students continue their classes one Sunday a month (10:35 a.m. – 12:25 p.m.). The dates are 9/18, 10/9, 11/13, 12/11, 1/8, 2/12, 3/12, 4/16, and 5/7. When you sign up for the Summer program, you agree to the Sunday classes as well. These are NOT optional.

There are still openings in the special PREP class for students in grades 8 to 11 (Fee is \$50 per student). This class takes place on Tuesdays, from 6:00 p.m. to 7:15 p.m. The class is working with the program, Decision Point, a video and group discussion program on living your faith as a teen and young adult.

LIFELONG AND ONGOING

Our Adult Faith Formation committee is over 20 years old. Its primary focus is to provide ongoing education and evangelization to the members of our parish. In that time, we have offered over 125 different programs; some topics have been repeated. Some have been movies on faith related

topics; some have been live speakers; most are DVDs; some are Scripture study; some are faith sharing. This year we would be offering two 'mini-retreats', one prior to Advent and one prior to Lent. We offered the retreats two years ago and they were well attended and appreciated by those in attendance. However, this year they will be live in the Church auditorium. The main reason we have chosen these two topics because we think most people have 'lost' the meaning of Advent and Lent. This year we will have Bill Donaghy from the Theology of the Body Institute who will offer reflections on the Incarnation and the Meaning of the Body for our Advent retreat; we will also have our very own Deacon Bob Skawinski who will offer reflections on mercy and forgiveness prior to Lent. Again, these will be live and in the Church auditorium- actually, God is in charge and we have free will and need to respond in prayer and sacrifice and fasting.

RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY
