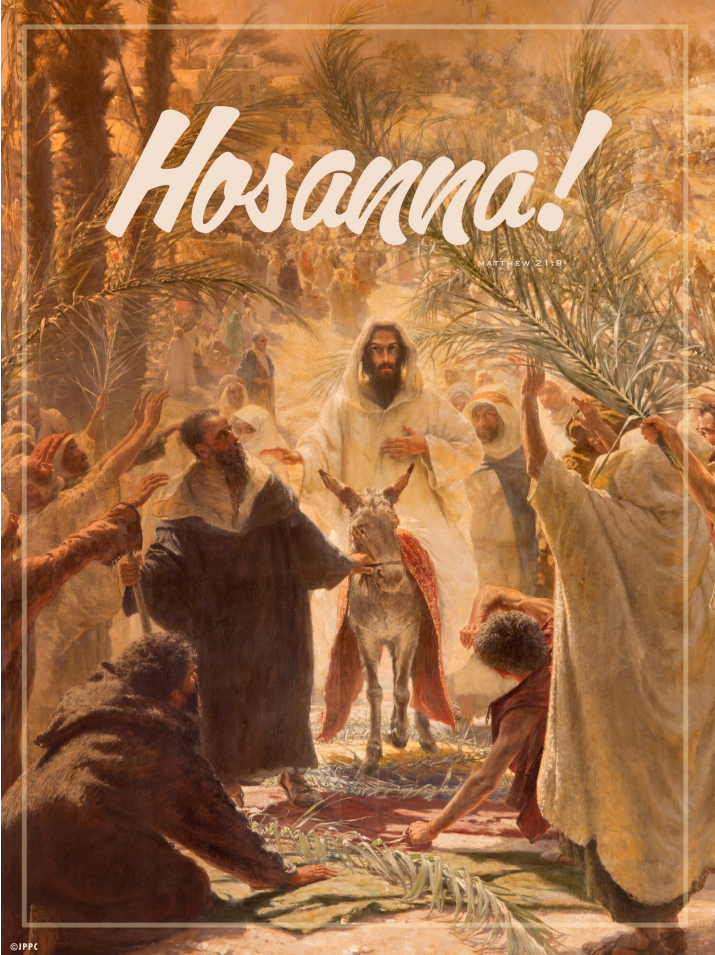

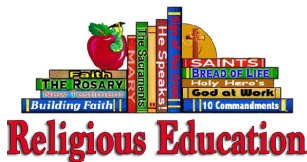

LIFELONG AND ONGOING

With the Apostolic letter “Patris Corde” (With a Father’s Heart), Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a “Year of St. Joseph” from Dec. 8, 2020 to Dec. 8, 2021.

The Holy Father wrote this Apostolic letter against the backdrop of the Covid-19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us see more clearly the importance of ‘ordinary’ people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble St. Joseph, ‘the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence’ who nonetheless played ‘an incomparable role in the history of salvation’. St. Joseph, in fact, ‘concretely expressed his fatherhood’ by making an offering of himself in love, ‘a love placed at the service of the Messiah who was growing to maturity in his home’. Writes Pope Francis, quoting his predecessor St. Paul VI. St. Joseph has always been venerated as a father by the Christian people. In him, ‘Jesus say the tender love of God’, the one that helps us accept our weakness because ‘it is through and despite’ our fears, our frailties, and our weakness that most divine designs are realized. Let us pray to St. Joseph often. Go to a website for prayers.

“Like us, Christ entered the world through the womb of a woman. He willingly experienced the fullness of human suffering. He breathed his last on the Cross at Calvary in order that He might save us. Therefore, ‘God is the foundation of hope: not any god, but the God who has a human face and who has loved us to the end’ (Spe Salvi 31).” How many of us would be willing to sacrifice ourselves for the life of another? Possibly many for love of spouse/parent/child/great friend! How many of us would be willing to die willingly for being accused of something for which they had no guilt? Without fair trial? However, Jesus did both and He stated quite emphatically that no one ‘takes’ His life, but it is He that lays it down for His friends, and, quite notably, without guilt of that for which He was accused. Further, not only innocent of any guilt or crime, He was without sin and lived a ‘perfect’ life, both human and Divine, in this world, on this earth to show us how it could be done. Then, after death, having conquered it fully, He rose from the dead in a new life, in a resurrected body, to show us what will be awaiting us after our physical death if we only follow Him, the Way, the Truth and the Life. So with this Easter celebration let us follow Him and do the very best we can in this world so we may be happy with Him in the next.

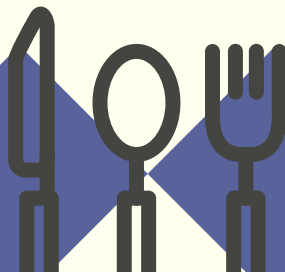
