

Reading I: Acts 2: 14a, 36-41

After proclaiming Jesus as Lord and Christ, Peter calls for his audience to repent and be baptized.

Reading II: I Peter 2: 20b-25

The author (not St. Peter himself) includes an early Christian hymn which stresses that Jesus' wounds heal us and bring us to the true shepherd.

The Gospel: John 10: 1-10

Jesus claims to be both the gate and the shepherd of the true flock. His parable is meant to reveal who He is. The term "good" here means "an ideal or model."
