RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY

"Although we may feel unsure how best to comfort those who mourn, we must stand with them in their time of suffering. Miscarriage touches the lives of many people, yet all too often this tragedy remains unaddressed. This lack of response not only often leads to unresolved grief, but also fails to clearly manifest our belief that each person, from conception onward, is precious and unique." Regardless of the length of pregnancy, be it days or weeks or months, any loss of child affects the mom, the dad and the family and needs to be grieved and mourned. The child is not just a 'clump of cells'. The child in the womb is a living human being with an immortal soul, created by God for a purpose and is a living manifestation of the love between the parents, regardless of intent and destined to live for all eternity. Why God calls these children home early is a mystery that will only be answered for each of us at our final judgement and meeting with God face to face. Let us learn to mourn these losses and help these parents and families, not with a pat on the back or a statement like 'you can have another'! They need to grieve not any differently as the loss of parent, sibling, spouse or any other born person.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us.

Intercessory Prayer: For those grieving after a miscarriage: May they be comforted by God's everlasting love and His presence amidst their sorrow; We pray to the Lord.

Rose of Life Intention: For all parents who have suffered the loss of a child, born or unborn.



This past week we celebrated several very important saints, not that all who have achieved their heavenly glory are not important examples to us. First was St. Dominic on 8/8, the saint to whom our Blessed mother gave the rosary, one of the most important weapons in our spiritual war-

fare leading to the title for Mary of Our Lady of the Rosary, and he was the founder of the Dominicans. St. Dominic is the patron saint of astronomers and natural scientists. The Dominicans are known as the Order of Preachers. Next, we had St. Clare, Virgin, true friend and confidant of St. Francis of Assisi and foundress of the Poor Clare's cloister order of nuns. St. Clare was declared the Patron Saint of television in 1958 by Pope Pius XII, because when St. Clare was very ill and could not attend Mas and was reportedly able to see and hear it on the wall in her room! Finally, we had St. Laurence, Deacon and Martyr. St. Laurence was one of the 7 Deacons of Rome under Pope Sixtus II who were martyred in the persecution of Christians by the Roman emperor Valerian. He was the first among Deacons who served in the cathedral church. After the execution of Pope Sixtus, Laurence (also Lawrence) was ordered to turn over the riches of the Church to the Roman emperor; he requested 3 days to gather the riches during which time he distributed them all to the indigent, crippled, blind and suffering and on the third day declared 'here are the treasures of the Church, you see, the Church is truly rich, far richer than your emperor'. He was then executed.

Emergency Fund at \$70,000; Help Still Needed

Working with members of our Parish and the local community, the Emergency Fund established by St. Ignatius of Antioch has raised more than \$70,000 to date to help those who have had significant damage to homes and property, much not covered by insurance, as a result of the recent flash floods. Those losses are estimated to be in the hundreds of thousands of dollars, so help is still needed and continued donations encouraged to help those with significant financial hardship.

The Fund is administered by volunteers from the Parish's Social Action Committee and local Knights of Columbus Council. There are several other community organizations who are collaborating with our Parish Team in order to maximize the impact of our combined effort. These include the Yardley-Makefield Lion's Club, the Christine M. McCaffrey Community Emergency Fund, and a private GoFundMe campaign.

We are very appreciative of the efforts and generosity of all of those who have helped raise funds to date and are currently prioritizing needs for efficient fund distribution. But much need remains to help our neighbors recover from this natural disaster. 
