

#### Reading I: Isaiah 22: 19-23

Eliakim is named by Yahweh to replace Shane as master of the palace. As a result, it becomes a hereditary position for his family.

#### Reading II: Romans 11: 33-36

This is a hymn to the merciful wisdom of God, as expressed by Paul in gratitude. He writes that God is nobody's debtor.

#### The Gospel: Matthew 16: 13-20

This is a pivotal passage and Peter's identification is the correct one for Our Lord. Peter in turn receives a compliment and then a commission to leadership.



# RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY

She is patroness of embroiderers, gardeners, florists and those who suffer ridicule for their piety and people who suffer family problems. Next, we celebrated St. Bartholomew who was one of the twelve apostles of Jesus according to the New Testament. Most scholars identify him as Nathanael who appears in the Gospel of John. He preached in India and Greater Armenia where he was flayed and beheaded. He also preached in Mesopatamia, Persia and Egypt. When one ponders the times that he lived, modes of transportation and how long it may take to get from one place to another, it is a wonder how these saints 'got around' to preach the Gospel to every nation! Do we spread the Gospel? At least to our family members, friends and co-workers? If not, why not?
