Reading I: Sirach 3: 2-6, 12-14

Here we read "the cornerstone of biblical ethics": Fear of the Lord embraces our duties to others, first of all to our parents.

Reading II: Colossians 3: 12-21

St. Paul offers a true formula for living family life on the Lord. He lists several virtues and then adds: "Over all these put on love."

The Gospel: Matthew 2: 13-15, 19-23

Referencing the Exodus, Matthew has Joseph tasked with taking the Child Jesus and His mother to Egypt to escape Herod's death order. When he returns home, Joseph settles in Galilee rather than Judea, where Herod's son holds forth.

Dec. 26 was the feast day of St. Stephen, the first martyr, the very first person who died for his faith. Is your faith strong enough that you would die for it? If not, why not? Stephen was a Deacon in the early Church in Jerusalem who aroused the enmity of members of various synagogues

by his teachings. He was accused of blasphemy at his trial where he made a speech denouncing the Jewish authorities who were sitting in judgment of him and was then stoned to death. He was one of seven Deacons assigned by the Apostles to distribute food and charitable aid to poorer members of the community of the early Church. The Greek speaking Jewish widows were being discriminated against in preference to the Hebrew speaking. Acts chapter 7 gives his testimony at his trial. His martyrdom was witnessed by Saul of Tarsus (St. Paul). He died between 33-36 AD at the age of 28-32. At the moment of his death it is said that he looked up and cried 'Look! See heaven open and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!' He prayed that the Lord would receive his spirit and his killers be forgiven and sank to his knees and fell asleep. He is known as a patron saint of altar servers. Dec. 26 is also the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Let us read on stories of the Holy Family and pray for their intercession for peace and wholeness in our own families and follow their example. Blessed and joyous New Year to all and let us hope 2024 will be a better year.

This past week, 12/28, we celebrated the feast of the Holy Innocents which commemorates the children slaughtered by King Herod in his attempt to destroy the infant Jesus (Matt. 2:16). Our First Communion/Penance Parent Meeting took place on Wednesday, October 25. If you did not get your packet, please come in to see Annmarie.






