

RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY



"We often assume parenthood happens easily after 'I do,' but for many married couples, it does not. For some, the joy of conception never happens. Others suffer repeated miscarriages. Still others experience secondary infertility... If you experience difficulty bringing a child into your family, know that you are not alone. God is with you, and his Church desires to walk with you... God has a beautiful plan for your life as a married couple." USCCB Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities "Seven Considerations While Navigating Infertility". One such plan may be adoption. There are tens of thousands of children in the U.S. awaiting adoption. While it may take some time and there may be some expense involved in adopting a child, it may be God's plan for a family suffering from infertility. Another option is to get proper medical advice as to the cause of infertility. There are many such resources such as NaPro technology (Pope Paul VI Inst) and 'Restorative Reproductive Technology' physicians and practitioners who go the 'extra mile' to determine the actual cause of infertility and address those causes with medications and surgery that are consistent with the teachings of the Catholic Church and completely avoid any type of 'artificial reproductive technology' (such as IVF) to allow couples to have children of their own. Unfortunately, some married couples are called to the suffering of never having children and that is a burden that we all need to acknowledge and for which we need to pray, as that too may be part of God's plan in His infinite wisdom for the good of those who are subject to same. 
KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS FREE THROW CONTEST WINNERS

SOCIAL ACTION COMMITTEE COLLECTION

The next collection for the Social Action Committee, which helps those in need both in the parish and throughout our community, will be held next weekend, February 25 & 26. Thanks to the many who support the Committee through donations and participation in its programs which include the annual turkey, school supply, and coat and sweater drives, as well as working with community organizations to provide food and financial assistance.

An example of ongoing community support throughout the year is the collection of nonperishable food items via bins at all church entrances as well as the Adoration Chapel in the Antioch Center. The donations are then collected and distributed weekly by Committee volunteers to Catholic Social Services. Last year, almost 6,000 pounds were provided.

Also ongoing is financial assistance to those in our area struggling to meet basic needs. So far this year, through your donations, we have been able to assist two parish families in significant financial need. They were faced with very hard decisions if not for your help. We also provided financial support to a local elementary school that was looking for ways to help several families/children in need. And we were able to purchase clothes for some homeless individuals who received medical care at Jefferson. Everyone who received your help asked us to extend their thanks and appreciation.

As always, donations may be made through on-line giving by designating the Social Action Committee as well as by using the yellow envelope in the envelope packet. Donation envelopes are also available in clear plastic containers at all church entrances. Look for them next to signs announcing the collection.
