

### First Sunday of Lent

February 26, 2023





### Reading I: Genesis 2: 7-9, 3: 1-7

The first man is created "out of the clay of the ground." So our human story begins. Soon after, the woman (her origin not mentioned in this account) eats the forbidden fruit and gives some to her mate. "Their eyes were opened" and so the human struggle with slavery to sin begins as well.

### Reading II: Romans 5: 12-19, or 5: 12, 17-19

St. Paul alludes to Genesis here, but he focuses on the theological truth that sin and death entered into the human story and brought on the terrible enslavement of sin.

### The Gospel: Matthew 4: 1-11

Jesus' desert experience closely parallels that of Israel, but where Israel fell into sin and alienation from Yahweh at times, the "New Moses," Jesus Our Lord, triumphs over satan's temptations. In doing so, Jesus quotes from Deuteronomy and declares His own obedience to God's First Commandment.

First Penance and Reconciliation is scheduled for Tuesday, March 7, at 7:00 p.m. for our students in second grade, and older, and their families.

We will celebrate First Communion on Saturday, April 29, at the 9:30 a.m. Mass and at the 12:00 noon Mass.



Last week we entered the Lenten season. Lent is a period of penitential preparation for Easter, the Resurrection of the Lord. It provides for a 40 day fast (Sundays excluded) in imitation of Christ's fasting in the wilderness before he began His public ministry. Christ gave us great ex-

ample of what to do in the face of temptation, rely on the Word of God! Try reading the Bible for 10 minutes a day; try skipping one meal a day; try visiting the Adoration chapel for 15 minutes once a week and present yourself to the very actual presence of the Lord (open daily M-F 10 Am to 8 PM). In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the RCIA for Adults. Contemplate the meaning and the origins of the Lenten fasting tradition. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts- not only through the distribution of money, but of time and talents. "The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs (the poor)" – St. John Chrysostom. Now is a great time to reflect, not just on the Super Bowl, but the 'super season' of the Catholic faith as we know who won, we know how the event went, and we know who the MVP was... Jesus, our Lord and Savior. You know what He did for you; what can YOU do for Him and His church?

Again, the basics of the Baltimore catechism can be recalled: Who made you? God made you. Why did God make you? Further Eldridge opines 'For above all else, the Christian life is a love affair of the heart...our lives are not a random series of events; they tell a Story that has meaning...we would like to picture goodness as being synonymous with safety'. Let us write our Story day by day in communication with the master 'Story teller' and be in love with Him as He is in love with us!
