

### The Solemnity of Mary Mother of God

January 1, 2023





#### Reading I: Numbers 6: 22-27

The priestly blessing given here reflects God's response to covenant fidelity. The conferring of God's blessing is reserved to Aaron and his sons.

#### **Reading II: Galatians 4: 4-7**

Here Paul uses one of his six proofs that humanity is saved by faith and not by the Mosaic law alone. The belief is that God sent the Spirit of His Son to have in their hearts their adoption as God's sons.

#### The Gospel: Luke 2: 16-21

Luke reports the joyful reaction of the shepherds to the angels' Good News. They then rush to Mary and Joseph to report to them what they heard. Likely not surprised, Mary then ponders it all "in her heart."




