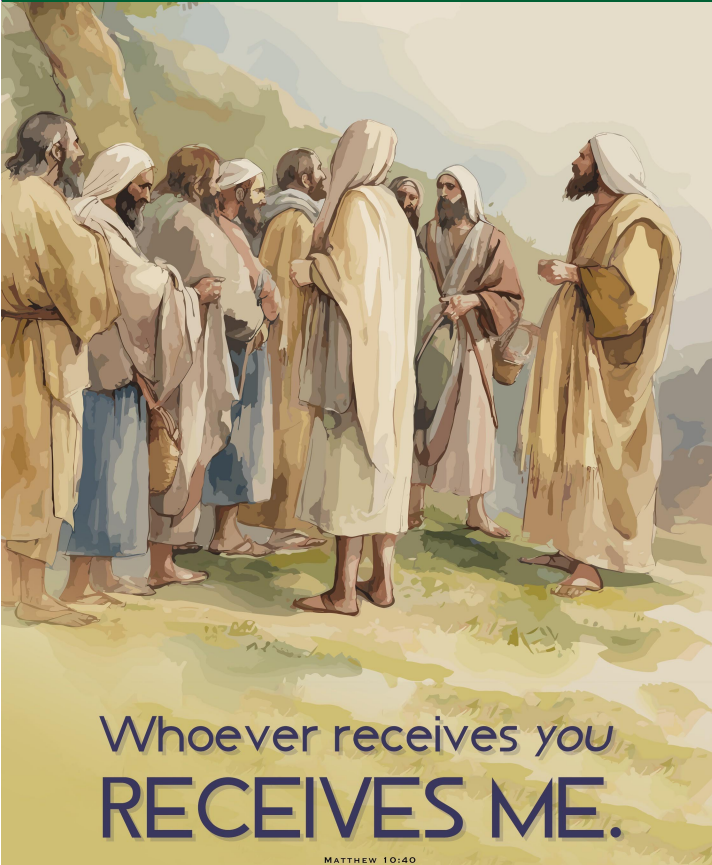

Reading II: Romans 6: 3-4, 8-11

The baptismal ritual represents the death, burial and resurrection of Christ. The convert to the Faith emerges as a new person, now living “for God in Christ Jesus.”

The Gospel: Matthew 10: 37-42

Whoever receives an Apostle receives Christ. He insists that we take up our individual cross and follow Him, showing care for the needy as did the Shunammite woman.

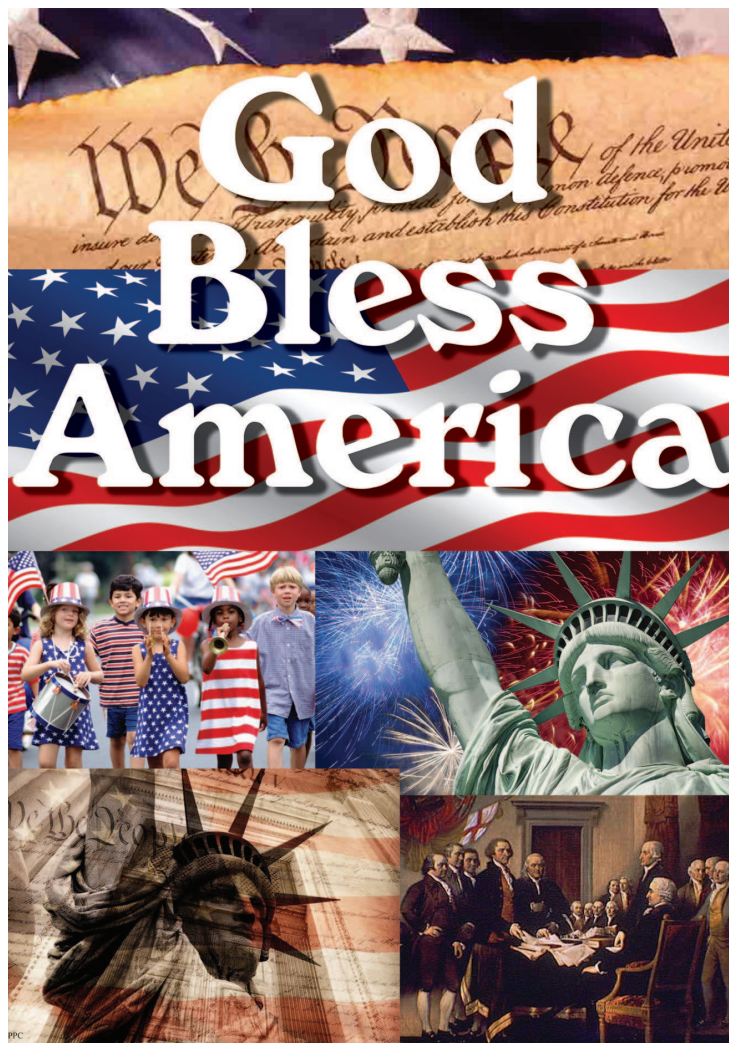

As we approach the annual celebration of the anniversary of our freedom, we really need to ponder whether we HAVE the freedom won by our ancestors in great battle and loss of life! Our Constitution states we have the ‘right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness guaranteed. Do all REALLY have the right to life? The unborn? The aged and infirmed? Innocent people trying to live their lives free of crime? Do we REALLY have liberty, or do we confuse liberty with license? Liberty is the freedom to do what we ought; license is a right or permission granted by an authority to engage in some act or a ‘self-indulgence that inevitably leads to tyranny from within and without’ (John Milton). License can also mean ‘lack thereof’ or people just doing what they like regardless of consequences or outcomes or injuries to others or suppression of the rights of others. Martin Luther King once said ‘in the end, we will remember not the words of our enemies, but the silence of our friends’ and it is that silence that can cause the greatest harm and heartaches. We CAN speak to God and ask for His relief; we CAN pray to the Saints and ask for intercession; we CAN speak up in our families, in the workplace and in the public square and voting booths. We cannot and do not need to relinquish our God-given inalienable rights to the ‘squeaky wheel’, the noisy minority or those who may call us names because we speak up. Let us pray that our families, our government and our country gets back on the right track. Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us.

July is the seventh month of the year and the fourth of seven months to have a length of 31 days. It was named by the Roman Senate in honor of Julius Caesar, it being the month of his birth. Monday, July 1 was the feast day of St. Junipero Serra whose statue several years ago was displaced by an angry mob in CA despite the fact that he founded the first missions in CA to protect the indigenous people in that area against those oppressing them. July 3 was the feast of St. Thomas the Apostle- he who doubted and evangelized India. July 4, the feast of St. Elizabeth of Hungary; July 6, we have the feast day of St. Maria Goretti, virgin and martyr; July 11, the feast day of St. Benedict who founded the monastic rule and gave us the Benedictine Order; July 14, St. Kateri Tekakwitha, the first North American canonized saint; July 16, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel; July 21, St. Lawrence Brindisi, priest and doctor; July 22, St. Mary Magdalene; July 25, the feast of St. James the Apostle and the anniversary of Humane Vitae giving us Church teaching on human sexuality/contraception/ responsible parenthood and family planning; July 26, feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, grandparents of Jesus; July 29, feast day of St. Martha and finally July 31, feast day of St. Ignatius of Loyola. An all- star banner month, this month that starts with Independence Day celebrating the birth of our nation and such freedom of will and faith as manifested by the saints we celebrate.
