



RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY

"Married love differs from any other love in the world. By its nature, the love of husband and wife is so complete, so ordered to a lifetime of communion with God and each other, that it is open to creating a new human being they will love and care for together. ... That power to create a new life with God is at the heart of what spouses share with each other. "United States Conference of Catholic Bishops "Married Love and the Gift of Life".

This week of Natural Family Planning awareness week. For those who don't know natural family planning or NFP or Fertility awareness -based methods (FABM's) is a knowledge of one's fertility as it was created by God and the couple uses that knowledge to plan their families according to their properly formed consciences to either achieve a pregnancy or postpone pregnancy. It is 98-99% effective and has no side effects, is easy to learn, backed by science and very inexpensive. God could have created children in any manner He wished but He gave to human married couples the ability to co-create new life and the Catholic Church teaches that the meaning of human sexuality demands the both the unitive and procreative aspects of the marital act be present at every union and be open to life and love and babies and bonding. Humanae Vitae (Pope St. Paul VI, July 26, 1968) reaffirms the 2000-year traditional teaching proscribing against all artificial contraception and sterilization. The Couple to Couple League and the Fertility Science Institute are the largest NFP teaching organizations in the world. The Creighton Model of NaPro technology is the best medical model of NFP and comes from the Pope Paul VI Institute in Creighton NE. There is also Billings, FEMM, and SymtoPro models.

Intercessory Prayer: May married couples embrace their call to total, faithful, and fruitful love with openness to new life; We pray to the Lord:

Rose of Life Intention: For Natural family planning and God's wisdom for creation.



This is natural family planning awareness week. This week commemorates the July 25, 1968 release of the Pope St. Paul VI encyclical Humane Vitae speaking to the true meaning of human sexuality, family planning, responsible parenthood and affirming 2000- year teaching on

prohibitions against contraception. This day is also the feast day of St. James the Apostle and precedes the feast day of Sts. Joachim and Anne, grandparents of Jesus. When was the last time you heard a homily on contraception? Abortion? Family planning? Responsible parenthood? They are very few and far between, if at all. Why? There is no question about Church teaching. There is no controversary as it is settled magisterial infallible teaching by several Popes in the past century. Yes, 85% of Catholics contracept and sterilize at the same rate as non-Catholics! Is it because such homilies/teachings may antagonize parishioners? Irritate them? Not appropriate for all audiences? After all, children and elderly will be present. This is the 55th anniversary of that encyclical which is probably the most controversial of all encyclicals ever written and not well received by many in the Church. To help us answer these questions and more, Pope St. JP II gave us Theology of the Body and Catholics need to learn the meaning of the body and the meaning of human sexuality and God's plan for life and love.

Once again the St. Ignatius Social Action Committee is partnering with the United Way to provide families with school supplies. With your help, needy students can get off to a great start in the new school year!


