

# RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY



"A woman with an unexpected pregnancy may have any number of fears and challenges: facing judgment from her friends and family, losing her job or housing, or being abandoned by the father of her child. Following Mary's example, we can ask ourselves how to better know these mothers, listen to them, seek understanding, and help them obtain the necessities of life for themselves and their children." The exhortations in this quote are exactly what crisis pregnancies centers do and in our area the Legacy of Life Foundation now has 3 centers serving women and families with unplanned pregnancies, support, guidance, and all the necessities they and their children will need to get a start on family life...for 3 years! LOLF has been servicing the Philadelphia area for 15 yrs. and has saved over 3500 babies from abortion. All services are free. All monies are donated. Free pregnancy tests and ultrasounds along with advocacy, support, equipment, supplies, clothing, insurance, job training, cooking classes, parenting classes and more. LOLF tries to alleviate the fears and remove the challenges and walk with women and their unborn babies throughout the pregnancy, even at times serving as labor coaches and being at deliveries. We occasionally also have the opportunity to arrange adoptions. Mother Mary was a 14 -year -old virgin when she conceived Jesus and not being married but betrothed faced the death penalty according to the law of Moses but still said 'let It be done do me according to thy Word' and so it was and is. We do not know for what purpose these children were created but we are not to abandon them or kill them, but to love them.

Our adult ed committee has been functioning pretty much continuously for the past 25 years here at St. Ignatius. We have offered over 200 programs and retreats and speakers throughout. Our committee is 'aging' and we are in need of new blood; younger blood; new ideas; new ways

of doing things. Our pastoral center (the old rectory) – the Antioch center as it is now called has been re-furbished and renewed. We will begin our new programs this Fall. We would love to have one or two or even more new members to our committee. We meet the first Wednesday of every month for about 45-60 minutes. We do not meet during the summer. We usually have our programs selected by May and then we are 'off' four months= meaning not a lot of your time. If you have thoughts about what you think our parishioners would like to hear/learn/ discern/discuss/pray join us. Let us know. This committee and its functions should not end for lack of interest. Once again the St. Ignatius Social Action Committee is partnering with the United Way to provide families with school supplies. With your help, needy students can get off to a great start in the new school year!




