



Happy Father's Day.

"Through our prayers and through the intercession of St. Joseph, patron of fathers, may fathers come to know the irreplaceable role they hold in the lives of their children, and the responsibility they share in welcoming God's gift of new life! Many of us can celebrate our fathers because they are still with us, although some may not be 'in relationship' with their fathers for whatever reason. Many do not have our fathers with us- we can still pray to them, for them and celebrate with memories their fatherhood and their 'yes' to our lives! Many in the prolife movement are very much into saving the babies and helping the moms, but offtimes the fathers are absent or forgotten. We need to pray for those men; we need to support them too and call them to pray to St. Joseph for the strength and the courage to do what St. Joseph did- stand up for, support and provide and protect and love his betrothed who unexpectedly conceived during their engagement, and 'adopted' Jesus as his own son and led Him into the man Our Lord became so He could be Father to us all! Thank you, St. Joseph; thanks to all fathers. We celebrate you today. We honor you. We remember you. ALL of us have fathers. Thanks to our Heavenly Father for the gift of life and the gift of Fatherhood. We all need to look to Jesus to see how He related to HIS Father in Heaven, completely willing to love Him unconditionally even to His death on the Cross.

Happy Father's Day to All Fathers.

Today we celebrate Father's Day. Last week we celebrated feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus which is a liturgical solemnity that falls 19 days after Pentecost on a Friday. The devotion is one of the most widely

practiced and well- known Catholic devotions taking Jesus Christ's physical heart as the representation of His Divine love for humanity. The feast can be traced to the 11th century. It marked the spirituality of St. Bernard of Clairvaux in the 12th century and of St. Bonaventure and St. Gertrude the Great in the 13th century. The very first liturgical feast was celebrated in 1670 through the efforts of St. John Eudes. In 1856 Pope Pius IX established the feast as obligatory for the whole church. The feast is also a special day of prayer for the Sanctification of Priests.

Father's Day is a day honoring fatherhood and paternal bonds as well as the influence of fathers in society. It was founded in America by Sonora Smart Dodd in 1910. It does, however, date back to 1508 when it was celebrated on the feast of St. Joseph March 19. No small coincidence that these two are celebrated today! Let all fathers dedicate their fatherhood to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and His father, St. Joseph and pray for the strength to be the leaders/providers and protectors they were called to be. One of the more common problems of contemporary society is the absence of fathers from the home, whether it be physical/emotional/spiritual/economic presence which can lead to fragmentation of families and poor mentorship for sons/future men! 1 in 4 children currently live without a father in the home, leading to 63% of all youth suicides, 90% of all runaway and homeless youths, 85% of all children with behavioral disorders and 71% of all high school dropouts. Let us pray for fathers including those of children in the womb.

If you need in formation or want to register your child(ren), please stop in the Religious Education Office, which is in the school building through the blue doors under the canopy.

Classes are held on Sunday mornings from 10:35 a.m. to 11:50 a.m. and on Monday evenings, from 6:30 p.m. to 7:45 p.m. The Summer PREP begins in the morning on July 17 and ends on July 21. This program continues on one Sunday a month from 10:35 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

NOTE: PREP REGISTRATION FOR THE 2023 – 2024 SCHOOL YEAR (beginning with the July 17 summer week) has begun. If your child is not registered in PREP yet, stop in the PREP Office.

**PREP Classes have ended for this year.** They will resume in July and September. Students in grades 8 to 11 are invited to participate in a video and group discussion program, Decision Point, on Tuesdays, from 6:00 p.m. to 7:15 p.m.

**RCIA** (The Rite of Christian Initiation for Teens and Adults) is now called OCIA (The Order of Christian Initiation for Teens and Adults). If you know of anyone who may be interested in becoming a Catholic, please give them my phone number so we can talk. They can call me even if they are not 100% sure yet.

If you are not presently on our PREP email list, and you would like information about Religious Education for any age group, please email Annmarie Flanagan at the address listed above or call 215-493-5204.

If your child is older than 2nd grade age and has not received his/her First Communion, please contact Annmarie as soon as possible.

<u>VBS:</u> Vacation Bible School Camp is scheduled for June 26 to 30 for students who will be entering grades K to 5 in the fall. We cannot have the program without volunteer help, especially adult help. Please let Annmarie know if you are able to help in any way.
