

Third Sunday of Lent

March 12, 2023





Reading I: Exodus 17: 3-7

Yahweh's third test of His people wandering in the desert is all about water. There is no scolding from the Lord. Moses receives instructions about providing water for the quarrelsome people. The final verse is the real test question: Is Yahweh present among us or not?

Reading II: Romans 5: 1-2, 5-8

How does God prove His love for us? St. Paul answers this question in a powerful way. While it may be easy to die for a good person, the fact is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners.

The Gospel: John 4: 5-42, or 4: 5-15, 19b-26, 39a,

An unnamed Samaritan woman comes to the well where Jesus is seated and in the course of their conversation, the woman concludes that Jesus is "the savior of the world" and then becomes His first missionary.

Our Charismatic prayer group is sponsoring a "Life in the Spirit" series every Tuesday evening at 7 PM in the Antioch center for 7 consecutive weeks with great guest speakers each week. Do you know what 'life in the spirit' is? Do you know who the Holy Spirit is? Do you live a 'life

in the Spirit or know how to do so? This is what the programs are all about. 'Life in the Spirit' is the spiritual preparation that leads to the prayer for an outpouring or baptism in the Holy Spirit. These 'seminars' for 7 (the 'perfect' number in the Bible) weeks makes reference to 7 weeks of prayer and expectancy Jesus' apostles and women- among whom Mary, lived from the Ascension until Pentecost. On the fiftieth day, the Holy Spirit (who resides in ALL of us since the Holy Spirit is 'the Lord, the Giver of life') fell on them and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different languages as the Spirit gave them power to express themselves (Acts 2:4). The Holy Spirit is the love that exists between the Father and the Son; animates all creation; awakens faith; comes unceasingly into the world; enables communication with Christ; grants gifts to all; helps men and women grow in spiritual freedom; is the master and source of prayer; is the 'principal author' of the Holy Scripture; restores the divine likeness; reveals God; reveals the Trinity; is the source of all holiness; brings about unity in the Church; directs and supports the Church and is responsible for the mission of the Church. We ALL received the Holy Spirit at baptism; we ALL came into existence through the Holy Spirit; we were ALL confirmed in the Holy Spirit and our bodies are 'temples of the Holy Spirit'. RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY



"We are facing an enormous and dramatic clash between good and evil, death and life, the 'culture of death' and the 'culture of life'. We find ourselves not only 'faced with' but necessarily 'in the midst of' this conflict: we are all involved and we all share in it, with the inescapable responsibility of choosing to be unconditionally pro-life" (The Gospel of Life 28). Many of us really and honestly don't think we need to 'engage' in any way this debate over life and death – this beginning of life/end of life debate. Everyone who currently lives has a body created in the image and likeness of God, whether they realize or admit so. They would NOT be here if they did not receive the 'gift of life'. The real question is what are WE doing with THIS gift? How do you treat a gift? Do you abuse it/destroy it/throw it away/give it away/ dishonor it? why have over 63 million surgical abortions have occurred since 1973? How about medical abortions from the abortion pill or hormonal contraceptives or IUD's- all of which have abortifacient effects- meaning can end a pregnancy by preventing implantation or killing an already implanted baby! Why do we have laws legalizing 'physician-assisted suicide'? On the one hand, we are concerned about suicide rates and mental illness, especially among our young, but, on the other hand many states are legalizing the killing of anyone who 'wants' to end their life?! Yes, there IS free will, and there has always has been since the original sin- but no one is taking away anyone's free will, just trying to teach how to exercise that will in choices between good and evil, between life and death. The battle will always be with us, but many need to stand up and join the forces of life and good to oppose the evils of death and destruction.
