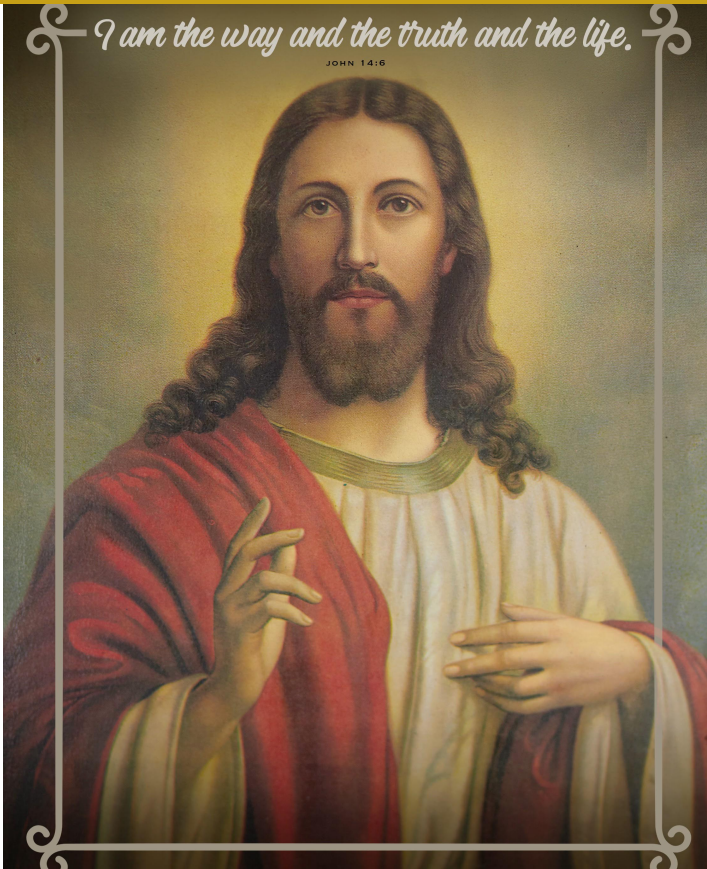

Fifth Sunday of Easter

May 7, 2023



Reading I: Acts 6: 1-7

The Greek-speaking Helenists feel neglected by the Twelve. This creates a need for apostolic helpers. Thus are seven “reputable” men selected for the task of serving the whole community.

Reading II: I Peter 2: 4-9

The writer pictures the Church as a “spiritual household.” Then he confers on it four titles that were once used of Israel in the Old Testament.

The Gospel: John 14: 1-12

Jesus calms the disciples’ fear of death and then responds to Thomas’ query about “the Way.” Meanwhile, Phillip struggles to “see the Father.” Jesus’ response adds up to two important answers for us to remember.

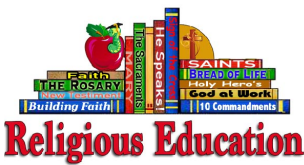

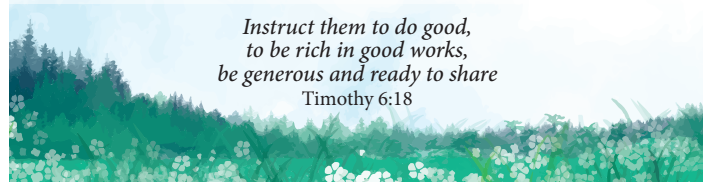
