

The prophet accuses the priests of disregarding God's ways, thereby leading the people astray. They had forgotten that Israel is God's extended family,

Reading II: 1 Thessalonians 2: 7b-9, 13

Paul urges the community to consider the conduct of the apostles among them as self-supporting men. He also offers thanks that they were receptive of God's word preached by those same apostles.

The Gospel: Matthew 23:1-12

Jesus strongly criticizes the scribes and Pharisees for not practicing what they preach. He then reinforces His position by His teaching on humility.

PARISH APPEAL

PROJECTS UPDATE

Over the past several years, we have been working hard to beautify our campus. This includes building upgrades, such as doors and windows, renovations to our Church sacristy, our Antioch center, both inside and out, and upgrades to our grotto, including fencing, the water feature and replacing the patio. We have also completed safety upgrades, such as the sidewalk replacement in front of the church, the patio next to the Antioch Center, and the maintenance of dead and dying trees around the property. We installed lighting for safety around the campus, as well as lighting for signs and to enhance our school's appearance. We are proud of what we have accomplished to date! Our newest upgrade is an irrigation system. This system will help us maintain our plantings, trees, and landscape. It should be noted, all of these upgrades were not paid for out of our general funds, but from special donations to our projects fund to enhance the safety, efficiency, and beauty of our parish home. We were fortunate and blessed to have donors and bequests provide the funding for these projects.
