

There are THREE locations now, one in Philadelphia directly across the street from the largest Planned Parenthood in PA doing over 6,000 abortions every year, one in Bristol originally established directly across the street from the central office of Planned Parenthood in Bucks County which closed 5 years ago and we would like to think through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit in our building and chapel across the street, and their NEWEST center in Warminster on Louis Drive, again across the parking lot from the only PPH in Bucks county. With God's help and appropriate financial support this third center will be successful and hopefully that PPH will close also! 
