

Reading I: Ezekiel 33: 7-9

The prophet is assigned the duty from the Lord to act as a watchman over Israel. As Babylon is about to destroy Jerusalem, his warning about trying to turn a wicked person to change his ways is crucial.

Reading II: Romans 13: 8-10

St. Paul turns to the Christian's obligation of neighborly love both as a summary of the Law of Moses and that of Christ on the subject.

The Gospel: Matthew 18: 15-20

Jesus gives us two different insights. The first is a three step procedure to follow when someone offends us, with the personal one on one ranked first. The second insight is the powerful and consoling truth that He is in the midst of any gathering formed in His name.






The St. Ignatius chapter of WWP begins on Tuesday, September 26, 2023










Save the Date! Welcome Back Beef and Beer Saturday, September 23rd
