

The First Sunday of Lent

February 18, 2024





Reading I: Genesis 9: 8-15

The story of the Great Flood and Noah's leadership is one in which the world is cleansed by water. There follows a covenant between God and the people symbolized by a rainbow which will mean the end of future rainstorms before they destroy the world.

Reading II: 1 Peter 3: 18-22

The victory of Christ over sin is applied to Christians by baptism. This was prefigured by the cleansing waters of the Great Flood.

The Gospel: Mark 1: 12-15

The brief and simple narrative of Mark contrasts with the more elaborate scriptural debate between the devil and Jesus, as portrayed in both Matthew and Luke, both of which followed Mark in time.



Ash Wednesday was upon us last Wednesday Feb. 14 and it is time to make a firm decision as to what type of 'sacrifice' you wish to 'do' during Lent. As you know, this is a season of prayer, fasting and abstinence in preparation for the greatest mystery of our faith, the Paschal Mystery- the Crucifixion and Resurrection of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. There is no 'Resurrection without the Crucifixion' as they say. Suffering has a meaning and Pope St. JP II has offered us great reflections in his encyclical 'Salvifici Doloris' which is available for free online at Vatican.org. If you have never read an encyclical, this may be one you wish to start! Everyone has some sort of suffering and many wonder the whys? Our loving God became man to show us how to live and how to love and how to suffer and why... for repentance for sin although He was without sin. There are 'salvific' benefits either for ourselves or others if we join our suffering with Christ for the remission of sins...ours and others. So, try to do one thing every day as a 'sacrifice' for the remission of sin... a Morning Offering prayer may be considered.

"We often assume parenthood happens easily after 'I do,' but for many married couples, it does not. For some, the joy of conception never happens. Others suffer repeated miscarriages. Still others experience secondary infertility... If you experience difficulty bringing a child into your family, know that you are not alone. God is with you, and his Church desires to walk with you... God has a beautiful plan for your life as a married couple." USCCB Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities "Seven Considerations While Navigating Infertility". One such plan may be adoption. There are tens of thousands of children in the U.S. awaiting adoption. While it may take some time and there may be some expense involved in adopting a child, it may be God's plan for a family suffering from infertility. Another option is to get proper medical advice as to the cause of infertility. There are many such resources such as NaPro technology (Pope Paul VI Inst) and 'Restorative Reproductive Technology' physicians and practitioners who go the 'extra mile' to determine the actual cause of infertility and address those causes with medications and surgery that are consistent with the teachings of the Catholic Church and completely avoid any type of 'artificial reproductive technology' (such as IVF) to allow couples to have children of their own. Unfortunately, some married couples are called to the suffering of never having children and that is a burden that we all need to acknowledge and for which we need to pray, as that too may be part of God's plan in His infinite wisdom for the good of those who are subject to same. Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us.

My name is Fr. Michael Shea. I am a Vincentian priest currently stationed at the Basilica Shrine of the Miraculous Medal in Philadelphia, PA. From Monday, February 19th through Friday, February 23rd I will be at St. Ignatius of Antioch Parish conducting a Marian Week of Prayer. Our theme will focus on our need to stay close to Christ and the opportunities we have to accomplish that through prayer and devotion to Mary. From Monday through Friday there will be two services each day. The morning service will be incorporated into the 9:00AM morning Mass. The evening service will be at a Mass beginning at 7:00PM. (The 7:00AM Lenten Daily Mass will not have a service with regards to the parish mission) A reflection will follow the proclamation of the gospel and each service will end with the recitation of the Miraculous Medal Prayers followed by the opportunity for sacramental confession. On Thursday we will celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing at both services. The Marian Week of Prayer will conclude on Friday, February 23rd.

I am looking forward to meeting all of you at our Marian Week of Prayer.



On the third Sunday of each month, our parish will provide prayer teams in the Adoration Chapel after the 7:30, 9:30 and 11:30 Masses. They will be there to pray with individual parishioners. There is nothing like the power of prayer to bring peace.
