### Faith Formation

There are many saints feast days to celebrate during the month of March. St. Katharine Drexel on 3/3; Sts. Perpetua and Felicity on 3/7; St. Frances of Rome on 3/9; St. Patrick on 3/17; St. Joseph on 3/19; the Annunciation of the Lord on 3/25. St. Katharine Drexel was an American heiress, philanthropist, religious sister and educator. She was the second person born in the U.S. to be canonized as a saint and the first one born as a U.S. citizen. Her shrine is in the Basilica of Sts. Peter and Paul in center city Philadelphia. She is the patron saint of racial justice and philanthropists. She founded the order of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament and used her fortune to create new schools for Native Americans and African Americans across the U.S. Sts. Perpetua and Felicity were Christian martyrs of the 3rd century. Perpetua was a recently married well- educated noblewomen said to have been 22 yrs. old at the time of her death and mother of an infant she was nursing. Felicity was a slave imprisoned with her and pregnant at the time and was martyred with her. They were put to death along with others at Carthage in the Roman province of Africa. They are the patron saints of expectant mothers/ranchers/butchers.. They are both commemorated in the Canon of the Mass. Finally, St. Patrick is well known and the patron saint of Ireland; he was a 5th century Romano-British Christian missionary known as the Apostle of Ireland He is responsible for bringing Christianity to Ireland and one of the patron saints along with St. Brigit of Kildare and Columba.

"We are facing an enormous and dramatic clash between good and evil, death and life, the 'culture of death' and the 'culture of life'. We find ourselves not only 'faced with' but necessarily 'in the midst of' this conflict: we are all involved and we all share in it, with the inescapable responsibility of choosing to be unconditionally pro-life" (The Gospel of Life 28). Many of us really and honestly don't think we need to 'engage' in any way this debate over life and death - this beginning of life/end of life debate. Everyone who currently lives has a body created in the image and likeness of God, whether they realize or admit so. They would NOT be here if they did not receive the 'gift of life'. The real question is what are WE doing with THIS gift? How do you treat a gift? Do you abuse it/destroy it/throw it away/give it away/ dishonor it? why have over 63 million surgical abortions have occurred since 1973? How about medical abortions from the abortion pill or hormonal contraceptives or IUD's- all of which have abortifacient effects- meaning can end a pregnancy by preventing implantation or killing an already implanted baby! Why do we have laws legalizing 'physician-assisted suicide'? On the one hand, we are concerned about suicide rates and mental illness, especially among our young, but, on the other hand many states are legalizing the killing of anyone who 'wants' to end their life?! Yes, there IS free will, and there has always has been since the original sin- but no one is taking away anyone's free will, just trying to inform how to exercise that will in choices between good and evil, between life and death. The battle will always be with us, but many need to stand up and join the forces of life and good to oppose the evils of death and destruction
