

ROSARY

The rosary is said Monday - Friday after the 9AM Daily Mass, on Saturdays before the 5:15PM Mass., and on Sundays before the 6:00PM Mass.



Reading I: Isaiah 50: 4-7

From the prophet's "Book of Comfort" section we find an obvious reference to Jesus, whose confidence remains even with His face covered in spittle.

Reading II: Philippians 2: 6-11

Paul quotes a beautiful hymn of his time which describes Christ's self-emptying and His exaltation. The hymn may have been in Aramaic.

The Gospel: Mark 14:1-15:47, or 15: 1-39

Mark's gospel has been described as "A Passion narrative with a long introduction." He wrote to comfort his community sometime in the 60's AD before the destruction of the Temple in 70 AD.

Faith Formation

Palm Sunday is today. This is Holy Week. How are we doing with our prayer? Fasting? Sacrifice? Alms giving? How about the Sacrament of Reconciliation? In this Sacrament, we have the opportunity to experience God's healing through forgiveness. There are usually 5 stages associated with this Sacrament: 1. Examination of conscience; 2. Contrition/sorrow for sins; 3. Confession of sins to priest (in persona Christi=Christ); 4. Absolution – priest announcing God's forgiveness; 5. Penance with a firm commitment to avoid sin and the near occasions of sin as pronounced in the Act of Contrition. Confessions are available every Saturday afternoon at St. Ignatius from 4-5 PM or by appointment; St. John the Evangelist on Saturdays from 2:45-3:45 PM or 8:30 AM on Tuesdays; St. Andrew's Newtown on Tuesday evenings at 6:30 PM and Saturdays starting at 4 PM; St. Mary's Cathedral in Trenton- Wed and Fri from 11:30 AM to 12 PM; Sundays at 11:30 AM; Our Lady of Grace in Penndel on Wed from 7-7:30 PM and Saturdays from 2:45-3:45 PM. So, there are plenty of opportunities. Laudate (a free app for iphones) has a great examination of conscience, or just do a search on any search engine and one will come up. Don't you want the grace? Don't you want the forgiveness? And most importantly, don't you want to be close to Jesus and receive His forgiveness? Now is the time. Just do it.

Recently, a young woman named Sarah come into a Legacy of Life Foundation center. Sarah was alone, stressed, disappointed and fearful that she may be pregnant. Sarah's pregnancy was unplanned and she didn't think she could have another child while already raising her 2 year old son on her own. Her mother had passed away earlier in the year and she was no longer with the father of the baby. Sarah was struggling financially and felt like the only choice she had was to end her pregnancy. During the appointment, the advocacy staff was able to listen to her and hold space for her grief and comfort her and advise her as to her options. Sarah is strong and independent and does not like to ask for help. As the advocate listened, she was able to assure Sarah that she did not have to ask for our help, that it was freely being offered to her. If she needed our support, then that support was available to her and she was invited to continue to address her issues through the center where the staff would accompany her through her pregnancy journey and make available all that was necessary to take care of her needs. During her ultrasound at the center, Sarah was moved by the sight of her little baby girl's fingers and toes! Sarah was able to find hope through the support, encouragement, and friendship that she found within the LOLF center. Sarah turned to the advocate and stated, with wonder and excitement, "Wow, look at my little peanut! I AM having this baby!" To quote Sarah after she gave birth to her baby girl, she told our advocate "God led me to the right place that day in November when I met you. Thank you for helping me make a better choice. I cannot imagine my life without my daughter."

The Legacy of Life Foundation operates three crisis pregnancy centers in Warminster, Bristol, and Philadelphia. They provide the following services for FREE: pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, counseling, and a three-year parenting program. Their mission transforms families and strengthens women facing unplanned pregnancies. Our 'baby bottle' (envelope) program will be held in 2 weeks, April 6-7; If you can help financially, please take an LOLF envelope home that weekend, make a financial donation (tax deductible) and bring the envelope back the following week. Please consider a generous donation-Thank you, St. Ignatius.
