

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord March 31, 2024





Reading I: Acts 10:34a; 37-43

Peter's sermon builds on the revelation he received and as a special witness to the resurrection that he became. The promised forgiveness of sins is now certain through Jesus.

Reading II: Colossians 3: 1-4

This selection, addressed to the citizens of an important city, urges them to think from a heavenly perspective, not an earthly one. Your Christian life is a hidden one but is made manifest by your lifestyle.

The Gospel: John 20: 1-9, or 41

The empty tomb is discovered, and the risen Jesus first appears to Mary Magdalene, She in turn becomes His messenger to Peter and John. They in turn enter the tomb and see the burial cloths in one place and the head cloth neatly rolled up in another.



Today is Easter, or more properly within Church circles the feast of the Resurrection of Our Lord. Eggs are associated with Easter because they represent new life and rebirth. The actual term 'easter' seems to go back to the name of a pre-Christian goddess of England, Eostre, who was celebrated at the beginning of Spring. The only reference to this goddess comes from the writings of the Venerable Bede, a British monk who live in the late seventh and eighth century. It is considered to be a 'moveable' feast in that it is celebrated on different dates every year depending on the occurrence of the spring equinox. Other terms, such as paschal candles, come from the Hebrew word for Passover...Pesach. However, regardless of history or various word derivations and secular associations like eggs and bunnies and spring, we Catholic need to know, need to celebrate, need to pronounce and need to understand that today is the celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead into life thus defeating death and giving all the opportunity for eternal life with Him in heaven. So, while we may all be having great dinners, easter egg hunts, time with family and friends, let us receive Jesus in the Eucharist and give Him thanks for His sacrifice out of love for us. The word Eucharist means thanksgiving and we as Catholics truly need to understand and believe that Jesus is present Body/Blood/Soul and Divinity in the very species of bread and wine consecrated by the priest. This despite the growing numbers of Catholics who do not believe in the true presence, hence, the year of Eucharistic revival. Thank you Jesus for loving us back into life through your suffering and death. Blessed celebration of the Resurrection of Christ.

St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.



Today, He is risen. Today, we are redeemed. Today, death is defeated and life everlasting is made available to all. Jesus was sent by our Heavenly Father to show us how to live, how to love and how to die. His Crucifixion cannot be fully understood without understanding the Resurrection as there is no everlasting life without suffering and death. So, yes, we all die and if we 'play our cards rights' and do the Will of the Father and repent of our sins we may be judged accordingly in that we hear the words "well done good and faithful servant, welcome into the Kingdom where my Father has prepared a place for you". But, although we all must die, children in the womb should not and do not die unless the Will of the Father, for whatever redemptive reason He wills for the good of those suffering such a loss. The non-God willed killing of these children is epidemic in our culture, our country, and the world. All these children were created in the image and likeness of God and has a God-ordained purpose in His plan for salvation. With over 63 million surgical abortions in the US alone since 1973 and still ongoing in a majority of states we have NO idea of how we have altered and damaged God's plan for salvation. On this day of the most wonderful celebration in the Catholic Church let us reflect on God's sacrifice for us, on His Will for us, on His love for us and on why He was willing to give His only begotten Son for us so that we may have the opportunity to eternal life in His Heavenly Kingdom. Let us ask Mary to lead us to a culture of life and love, a culture that respects all life form conception to natural death.




